THE SOUTHLAKE STORY

A PASSION TO CARE, A COMMUNITY TO MÁKE IT POSSIBLE.



For almost 100 years, Southlake has shown a passion to care for our communities. From humble beginnings as a six-bed facility, Southlake has evolved into a 426-bed hospital that provides leading-edge health care, including regional programs serving a population of more than 1.5 million people.

Despite rapid population growth in our communities. Southlake continues to meet the changing needs of our patients while maintaining the feel of a community hospital, setting us apart. Our team of compassionate physicians, nurses and clinicians make the difference – but they couldn't do it without the help of our many generous donors.

Our investors – the individuals, families, businesses, service groups and foundations who give through Southlake Foundation have helped Southlake deliver leading-edge care close to home for decades. Donors like SmileZone Foundation, whose generous support transformed three clinical areas at Southlake into bright, cheerful spaces, providing a better environment for young patients and staff alike. And generous individual support, like that of the attendees of the Southlake Golf Tournament, who collectively funded the upgrade of operating room lights in two of Southlake's surgical suites. Now, thanks to additional support, these lights have been upgraded in each of Southlake's 16 operating rooms, ensuring better light with no discolouration and greatly reducing shadows for the surgical teams at work.

We were also proud that donor support made it possible for the first patient to be scanned using the new 3 Tesla MRI in early April, 2018. This equipment is the first of its kind in Ontario, and has now been used for more than 8,857 patient scans, helping ensure that early diagnosis and the best possible outcomes are available for patients right here at Southlake.

Having the right tools in hand means that our expert clinicians are equipped to provide the highest level of care with compassion and it's all made possible thanks to the investments of our donors.

LE'S STORY

IT WAS THE NIGHT AFTER HER BABY SHOWER WHEN LE'S WATER BROKESIX WEEKS BEFORE HER DUE DATE.

A first-time mom, Le and her husband were worried, and the Keswick couple came to Southlake where they confirmed that it was no false alarm. Baby Amber was born six weeks premature, weighing just 5 lbs 4 oz and suffering from jaundice. Le was able to hold her newborn daughter for only a minute or two before she was whisked to the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU).



LE'S STORY

Jaundice is a serious condition common in newborns that can cause permanent effects if untreated, and Southlake's phototherapy equipment is used every day.

Amber was initially placed in a phototherapy isolette and exposed to the special light used to break down the blood cells. While this works well for many babies, Amber didn't sleep well lying exposed. That lack of sleep was in turn causing her to lose weight, when what she needed as a preemie was to grow. Southlake's expert nurses had another solution.

Instead of the isolette, they were able to use a bilirubin blanket - an innovative portable phototherapy device that wraps around the infant, allowing them to be swaddled, held, fed, and rocked while receiving their treatment. This makes important skin-to-skin contact possible during treatment, which is best practice for healthy development and bonding.


Bilirubin blankets are only available because of donor support, and Southlake's NICU acquired their first bilirubin blanket two years ago. The equipment had such positive results that two more bilirubin blankets were funded last year, now shared between the NICU, Postpartum and Paediatric departments to treat newborns in need.

For baby Amber, this piece of equipment was vital. It provided her with the treatment she needed and kept her calm and comfortable throughout, providing a better experience for both baby and mom. Soon enough, Amber started to gain weight. After two and a half weeks, she was ready to go home.

The first-time parents had been nervous about caring for their newborn on their own. But, thanks to the personalized attention and support from the staff at Southlake during their experience, they felt confident about everything from diaper changing to bathing, and Amber and her family are now thriving at home.

Both Le and her husband view their experience at Southlake as a blessing in disguise, and are grateful to have had that kind of compassionate care during such a difficult time.

For almost 100 years, Southlake has been a place our communities have trusted to provide nothing but the best care for their families. And as technology and innovation improves, those same communities have helped us to keep pace in order to continue providing the level of care our patients expect and deserve.




